**6.** <u>Inter-School Athletics Competition 2018-19</u>: Team training started in mid-August and took place every Monday, Wednesday and Friday and from September onwards after school. Our boys worked very hard and trained very well.

Boys were encouraged to take part in the South China Inter-school Athletics Competition held in late November 2018.

Training continued during the school holidays. We undertook five training sessions during the Christmas holidays in lieu of the training camp that couldn't be held again due to difficulties in accommodation. In addition, we held three training sessions during the Lunar New Year holidays. Over 40 boys attended each training session to prepare for the competition which took place at the end of February 2019.

The Inter-School Athletics Competition this year was intense. Unfortunate for us, two key sprinters of our C grade team were injured early on in Day One of the competition. One of them pulled his hamstring during the last 20m of his 100m heat in the morning. He was thus unable to take part in the 200m in the afternoon. The other sprinter also pulled his hamstring after completing his 200m heat. He had previously run the 400m heats in the morning. As a result, we would only qualify with one sprinter each for the 100 and 400m C Grade finals and none for 200m. Despite this setback, we remained ahead of our opponents on points through Days 1 and 2. However, we had to work for every additional point in every event in order to keep our leading position.

Throughout the competition, our boys showed confidence and the determination to win. During the competition, we set 51 personal bests, 15 of them were in A Grade, 21 in B Grade and 15 in C Grade. Furthermore, we captured 8 gold medals, 8 silver medals and 9 bronze medals out of 43 events.

At the end of the competition, we captured the A and B Grades championships and came second in C Grade and the overall championship. Even though we ultimately came second overall, we were impressed by the boys' fiery spirit and indomitable hearts to win. They are worthy of our praise and should pride themselves with the results achieved.

Special thanks must be given to my colleagues, Mr. P. Cheng, Mr. Hui Wai Hei, Ricky and Mr. Ho Mau Wang for their hard work; our school captains, Mr. Lin Long Kau and Mr. Chan Ho Wa Alex for their wholehearted dedication; and all coaches and athletes for their wholehearted dedication. Their diligence is much appreciated, and we will continue to do our best in the coming years.
